"At UPMC (University of Pittsburgh Medical Center) we take safety very seriously. In an effort to provide the safest possible means of egress, we decided to add photoluminescent inserts to our stair treads. We tested three different products in a stairwell at Presbyterian Hospital in Oakland, PA. With the high amount of foot traffic that our stairwells are exposed to, we found that Jalite's product was much easier to maintain than the others. Jalite's product also had a substantially brighter appearance than the others. Nextlite and Franklin Interiors collaborated in the creation of an installation process that would accomodate our inability to "shut down" our stairwells. In conclusion, Nextlite provided a solution to a difficult problem."
